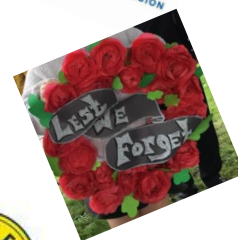

As we come to the end of our Autumn Term, we are delighted to share all the exciting learning experiences your children have enjoyed.

After the children settled into our daily routines, our journey began with the topic "Making waves." Children explored how sounds are made and how they travel through different materials, everyday noises, listening games to sharpen auditory skills and musical instruments to create and compare sounds. The children loved experimenting with sound and discovering how it shapes the world around us.

After half term we turned our attention to "Night Sky." Highlights included learning about the solar system, including the Sun, Moon, and planets, understanding why we have day and night and how the Earth moves, observing stars and constellations through stories and creative art projects, discovering nocturnal animals and their special adaptations. This topic sparked curiosity and wonder, and the children showed great enthusiasm for exploring space and the creatures of the night. We also need to mention how well the children performed in both the harvest festival and our nativity, they were great at learning the songs.

Witham Class News

Witham Class have been digging into the past exploring our topic 'Dinosaur Detectives'.

Year 1 and 2 have learnt about the life of Mary Anning in History, finding out about her discoveries which she initially called curiosities before later finding out that they were fossils. We had a go at being palaeontologists exploring and digging for our own fossils.

In English, we have created carefully planned riddles which used adjectives to describe various dinosaurs and wrote our own dinosaur adventure stories where we were the main characters.

In Music, we have had a fantastic time learning how to play rhythms on djembe drums, across the term we have learnt to play five songs including two Christmas songs.





Nene Class News

This term, Nene Class have been busy creating some truly wonderful work!

We wrote our own amazing versions of *The Iron Man* by Ted Hughes, using powerful descriptions and imaginative ideas to bring the story to life. In art, we learned how to paint like Claude Monet, experimenting with light, colour and brushstrokes to create beautiful impressionist-inspired pieces.

During Parliament Week, we learned all about how Parliament works and even created our own political parties, sharing ideas, debating and voting just like real MPs. We also prepared for the Christmas Service at St. Luke's, learning and performing a variety of festive songs and stories. The children worked incredibly hard and shone brightly during the celebration—well done, Nene Class!



Welland Class News

Throughout the autumn term, Welland have worked with enthusiasm and focus across the curriculum. In History, the children explored the Industrial Revolution, considering whether it was a significant turning point in British history. This learning was enhanced by a visit from Nick Gratton, who shared a model steam engine and helped deepen pupils' understanding of early locomotives as well as how these were influential during the Industrial Revolution.

During our Science lessons, the focus was on Materials, with children learning how to classify materials and investigate solutions, reversible changes and irreversible changes. They worked hard to create hypotheses and investigate whether their hypothesis was correct or not. Alongside this, pupils continued to build their Computing skills, successfully using spreadsheets and creating detailed vector drawings. In Music, the class learned to play the ukulele, developing confidence with different chords and performing a range of pieces, including *Thunder* and several Christmas songs.

Welland also took part in several enrichment activities this term. On European Languages Day (26th September), pupils sang French songs, participated in a French café role-play and produced artwork inspired by the Eiffel Tower. During Parliament Week, some pupils visited Spalding Council offices to learn about local government and debates. This experience led to a lively class debate on whether school uniforms should be banned.

Overall, Welland have shown excellent engagement in their learning and have produced high-quality work across the curriculum throughout the Autumn term.
